Focus: relationship between Vulnerability, Mobility and Exclusion

 Problematic relationship between opportunities and constraints, which hinders the satisfaction of needs (Fullin 2002: 553)

 Vulnerable groups are less mobile and "motile"

(Orfeuil 2004; Le Breton 2005; Fol 2009)

Vulnerability

Immobility

Self-reinforcing process

Exclusion

 Process by which people are prevented from participating in the economic, political and social life of a society (Kenyon et al. 2002: 210-211)

(In)accessibility

 (In)ability to reach and engage in activities and opportunities
 (Farrington & Farrington 2005:2)



Overview of Research

Aims: (1) to understand the role of vulnerability in influencing accessibility to opportunities; and (2) to capture the role of mobility in mediating the relationship between vulnerability and accessibility

Stages:

- 1) Spatial analysis of Potential Access (i.e. Kernel Density estimation of opportunities available in the proximity)
- Quanti-Qualitative Analysis of Potential for Mobility (i.e. needs, options, competences, conditions) and Actual Mobility and Access (i.e. modes of transports, activities, constraints, coping strategies)

Sample: 51 unemployed (n=20) or precarious workers (n=31) living in Milan (n=26) and Lyon (n=25)

Findings

- 1. Access to basic (i.e. pharmacy, physicians, supermarket, etc.) amenities is ensured
- 2. Vulnerability is strictly linked to mobility:
- a) it implies a heightened need for mobility (i.e. car-dependent jobs, travel to cheaper goods, soup kitchen, etc.)
- b) it constrains motility and mobility (i.e. lack of resources for mobility, no refund of work-related travel costs, forced car-ownership)
- 3. Although the mobility and access to opportunities are constrained by vulnerability, the respondents are in many cases mobile
- 4. Mobility is mostly linked to necessary activities
- 5. In Lyon wider protection of access and mobility ensured by policies than in Milan





Six different configurations

Constrained mobility, accessibility and vulnerabilisation (n=7)

Constrained mobility and accessibility due to policy (n=7)

Immobility and inaccessibility (n=3)

Vulnerability, mobility, accessibility

Car-ownership and accessibility (n=15)

No car-ownership and inaccessibility (n=8)

Protected from the risks of inaccessibility (n=11)

Conclusions

- Importance of mobility in influencing the possibilities of participation of individuals in relevant activities (especially employment)
- Vulnerability constrains the motility, mobility and access to opportunities and is related to a demand for mobility
- Need to revise the link between vulnerability, (im)mobility, and accessibility
- Inaccessibility to non-compulsory activities risks to reduce the potential of the urban life (Lefebvre 1970)

Interviews

No car-ownership and inaccessibility:

And there is someone who refuses a job because of the distance, of the gas... And me, I travel for one hour and a half, I move, And I am still unemployed! [...] I do not understand that...

(I., Lyon, unemployed, woman, 49 years, PA=0.36, MO=0.00, AO=0.00)

Immobility and inaccessibility:

• Before I lived with my mother and my sister. Since my mom's death I live with my sister. [...] I do not go out, except for shopping and other errands. [...] I do not look for a job... In this period it's not worth it... I do odd jobs, if a person I know tells me...

(S., Milan, unemployed, man, 60 years, PA=0.41, MO=0.00, AO=0.17)

Mobility, accessibility and vulnerabilisation:

Les conditions de travail qu'ils m'avaient proposé au début se sont pas révélées pas du tout la réalité de la suite. Du coup
[...] moi je me suis investi beaucoup sur le plan personnel et financier [...] financièrement la location de la voiture c'était à
mes frais, aucune indemnité et km remboursés... ça ma cout plus cher aujourd'hui travailler pour de gens comme ça que ce
que ma rapporte [...] C'est un travail qui me cout cher là!

(M., Lyon, precarious worker, woman, 43 years, PA=0.36, MO=1.00, AO=0.17)

Mobility, accessibility and vulnerabilisation:

• Last week I stayed at Saint Fons [...] I work in the cleaning industry here, and all the workplaces are in the municipality. Also my family lives here. Now, I don't have, how do you say, the utility to move


